1. You have arrived for your shift at the station. Please turn your radio on, ensure that it is on the correct talkgroup to hear new calls and show that the battery percentage is above the county recommended amount for a field-ready radio.
2. Identify the Scan function icon on your screen to verify that it is turned on and then tell your proctor what the average radio scans in the MCFRS fleetmap.
3. What is meant when we say that we follow the Washington Post Test?
4. To which talkgroup does pressing the home button (which resembles a house) take you?
5. Fire Department Talk Around (FD TA) is used in a number of circumstances. On a call, when should you use it?
6. What is meant when we say **intrinsically safe**?
7. You are riding E3 (right) on the engine and have been dispatched to a box on 7A4. Go there on your radio.
8. You have arrived on the scene of a call, but your radio is honking at you, indicating that your radio cannot reach the tower. If you need to make a transmission to another firefighter on scene, how can you do so?
9. The incident commander has arrived and declared that the DVRS is now active. Switch your radio to 7A7. Name two things that would indicate you are now on an active DVFS channel.
10. Turn your radio off (so as not to launch a real emergency notification during this test). Suppose you accidentally set off your EB. What two things do you need to do, in order to reset the EB?
